2022 was a Remarkable "Reunite & Celebrate" Year for Don Diego Scholarship Foundation

We began 2022 by joyfully returning to in-person meetings and activities paused since the COVID-19 pandemic struck in early 2020. These included Plant*Grow*Eat and our festive June 24, 2022 Gala. Both events celebrated the first year back for the San Diego County Fair. Also midway through the year, we bid a happy retirement to inaugural 1986-2022 Executive Director Chana Mannen and an equally happy welcome to incoming Executive Director Ashley Colburn McCaughan.

We completed the year by electing a new slate of officers and preparing to move forward energetically into 2023 by introducing new programs such as the Alumni Club while reinvigorating ongoing efforts such as the Legacy Brick opportunity, Endowed Named Scholarship program, social media outreach and multifaceted publicity. Significantly in 2022, thanks to the largesse of donors, including generous Board members, we awarded \$55,000 to 18 exceptional students from diverse backgrounds throughout San Diego County; bringing the total to more than \$1.2 million shared by 362 students since our 1986 inception.

Don Diego-Sponsored Plant*Grow*Eat Students Blossomed at the Fair

Number of Buses Sponsored: 27 Money Raised: \$17,330



As the coastal fog gave way to summer sunshine on the morning of June 15, 2022 at the Fair's Infield Farm, it was difficult to determine who was more excited: Don Diego Plant*Grow*Eat (PGE) donors, who awaited busloads of elementary students from Title 1 schools throughout the County; or the kids who bounded off buses with their lovingly nurtured edibles on proud display.

One teacher said, "Our students have been tending to their radishes as if they were precious little babies. They've been so excited to watch them grow and now to be here doing things they've never done before: ride a bus, receive a ribbon for their veggies, and meet farm animals."

After the pandemic pause, the Fair's PGE program, which teaches youngsters about agriculture and nutrition from the ground up, was back in full bloom. Sponsor representatives, including Master Gardeners, Del Mar Kiwanis, the Del Mar Foundation, and Del Mar Mayor Dwight Worden, confirmed they love to support the program monetarily and by visiting with the children. Some serve as judges. All are enthusiastic about helping children – especially those who live in urban apartments without yards - learn where their food comes from. The program has been going and growing for decades. Donors can sign up to sponsor a bus on the website throughout the year.



Alumni Club Debuts

Transforming the Future.

As 2022 came to an end, the Foundation launched an ambitious program based on an innovative

idea by Board member John Hoeflich: a Don Diego Alumni Club inviting all and only the 350+ past scholarship recipients to become charter members of a group that will fund scholarships, so they can help future recipients excel in college, career and life.

The very first charter member to join the Club was 2003 recipient/current Board Treasurer Alysha Stehly. She said, "I know firsthand the huge impact our scholarships make in students' futures. I hope together we alumni can give back by creating this unique scholarship. If we all donate a little, we can make a big impact as we pay it forward to the next generation of Scholars."

To date, four past recipients have joined the Alumni Club. The ongoing effort should gain in momentum.





"We are daughters of two immigrants," say former Miss Julian Nicole (Nikki) and her sister, former Teen Miss Julian Alyssa Arias. "Our mother, Rosalina, immigrated

from Oaxaca, Mexico when she was 20. She worked as a nanny, learned English, and used her skills to become

a paraprofessional. Our father, Josue, immigrated from El Salvador at age 16 to escape the Salvadoran Civil War. He worked his way up to become Julian High School's head of maintenance. Their journey to success was not always easy. There were times when all we ate were PB&J sandwiches, just to make the mortgage payment."

In 2020, Valedictorian Nikki won Don Diego's \$20,000 CGW Family Foundation Scholarship funded by the family of Board Vice Chair John Hoeflich, covering four years of matriculation at UC Davis, where she majors in Managerial Economics with an emphasis in Business Economics and Agriculture Business Economics. As she works toward becoming a veterinarian, this extraordinary Scholar-Leader continues giving back to FFA and her Julian community.

In 2022, Valedictorian Alyssa won Don Diego's Juanita Hayes \$2,500 FFA scholarship funded by Board Chair Hayes, which she is using to join her sister at UC Davis this fall. Alyssa's stated goal: "To pursue a career as a lawyer. My dream is to work for the UN!" Along the way, she says, "I want to become an immigration lawyer to help people like my parents who want to come to the U.S. to change their lives; people who believe in the American Dream

The Arias family embodies that Dream. Rosalina and Josue Arias burst with pride as they proclaim, "Our girls are a huge blessing to us. We believed our children should do better than ourselves, and here they are both UC Davis students! Being first-generation college students is thanks to their hard work, and we thank Don Diego for believing in them."
